

GA-U

The state disability program for low income people in Washington (General Assistance also known as GA-U or GA-X) is not enough to live on but enough to keep many disabled adults in housing and keeping them from homelessness as well as providing medical care. This essential program is at risk of cuts or elimination. If the program is eliminated or even reduced, many disabled adults with either physical or psychological incapacities (many have both) will face homelessness and no medical care. GA-U is especially at risk in the State Senate. Please contact your state legislators and let them know how important it is to keep this program. On the positive side there is a push to revamp GAU and rename it Disability Lifeline. This would be a more comprehensive program than GA-U is now so when you call to keep GA-U please let your legislator know you support the Disability Lifeline
